NOTRE DAME OF MARYLAND UNIVERSITY DINING SERVICE POLICIES 2024-2025

As members of the Notre Dame of Maryland University community, the policies of the campus Dining services are outlined below. Failure to adhere to the campus dining policies is considered a violation of the honor code.

- 1. Doyle Dining Hall is an all-you-care-to-eat facility. In order to enter the dining hall you must have a valid Notre Dame ID card with declining balance points; a meal plan or purchase meals using cash/credit card (VISA, MasterCard) to access Doyle Dining Hall. University ID's are not transferable.
- 2. In order to use the residential meal plan, a valid **NDMU ID** must be presented upon entering the dining hall. Access to the dining hall will be denied without proper identification.
- 3. All resident students are required to have a resident meal plan. <u>Meal plans cannot be shared</u>.
- 4. Meal plans and block plans are in effect only during the academic year.
- 5. Entrance to the dining hall is limited to the front glass doors, located at the front of the dining hall. Guests are not permitted to enter the dining hall through exit doors; nor are guests permitted to allow others access through the exit doors.
- 6. Takeaway meals are restricted to the use of the Eco-friendly reusable food containers available for purchase from the cashier. Takeaway meals will count as a meal swipe and will replace the option of eating in the dining hall for that meal service. Otherwise removing food from Doyle Dining Hall is prohibited.
- 7. No dishes, flatware, or glassware may be removed from Doyle Dining Hall. Approved reusable "To Go" containers are available for purchase with the cashier.
- 8. Dining hall service days are posted at the door as you enter Doyle Dining Hall. Dining facilities may close for class break periods. These closures will be posted in advance. If open, meal plans are not in effect.
- 9. The Dining Services week starts with Friday breakfast and ends with Thursday dinner.
- 10. SAGE Dining Services is the exclusive food service provider for NDMU. <u>Outside</u> catering is not permitted.
- 11. Requests for dietary accommodations must be first registered with the Director of Disability Services. An official physician's letter detailing the diagnosis and requirements is required.
- 12. Takeaway meals are available if you are ill and unable to get to the Dining Hall. You must give a signed, dated note with your ID card to your CA who will bring a meal to you.
- 13. If you are part of a meal plan and work off campus, a bag meal can be provided for you with at least three (3) days' notice.
- 14. If you are an athlete and part of a meal plan, a bag meal can be provided for you with at least three (3) days' notice.
